# 6. NEW BUSINESS (Notice of Motion) – Items for Council Advice to the Board

# **Full Program Proposal: Certificate in Mental Health and Substance Use Work**T. Gill spoke to the item.

Due to the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic and the current opioid crisis on BC's population, the Ministries of Health and Post-Secondary Education and Future Skills are responding to this need by creating a new mental health and substance use worker role within the health care system.

This new Certificate will build on the existing Community Mental Health Work Certificate program and adds content related to medication management, mental health and addictions, trauma-informed care and professional practice. A theme of indigenization, equity, diversity and inclusion is woven throughout the curriculum.

In addition to the program proposal, the courses have been changed (from CMHW to MHPS) to reflect the approved change in department name from Community Mental Health Work to Mental Health and Personal Support Work.

E. Kirkpatrick added that the Ministry is now actively recruiting and interviewing for this position.

The initiators extended their appreciation to the Programs Committee and Enrolment Services for all their work and assistance with this program.
