

MTD PREP THEORY ONLINE Fall 2020

This course is designed to teach the rudimentary elements of music theory, and to prepare the student to meet the requirements for the MTD theory entrance assessment. The materials covered in this class are approximate to the materials assessed by the Royal Conservatory of Music's Grade 8 Theory Exam.

Course Overview

1. Basic notation of pitch and rhythm
2. An understanding of and the ability to notate:
 - The Major/Minor scale system including key signatures and the circle of fifths
 - Intervals
 - Chords, including both triads and 7th chords and their inversions
 - Simple and Compound time, time signatures, and the conventions of organizing rhythm into complete measures
3. An introduction to modes and other scale systems, as time allows

Students will be exempt from writing the MTD Theory assessment based on their class work and results of the final quiz. Those whose results are low or borderline will be asked to write the assessment and be provided with specific areas to work on to help them to succeed.

It should be noted that this course is highly intensive, and is best suited for the musician who wishes to review and solidify their understanding of theory. Further, it is more suited for the highly motivated student with some basic ideas of theory and notation who can absorb this material very quickly than the one with absolutely no experience in reading or writing music or of an understanding of basic scales and chords. For the student with no previous music theory experience, it is strongly recommended that they study and learn at least some very basic music theory before taking this course.

Required Textbook

The required text for this course is a workbook called **'The Complete Elementary Music Rudiments' (M. Sarnecki, 2nd Ed.)**, and is available at Long & McQuade stores. The prospective student is encouraged to get it and begin studying it well before the course begins.
