

General information

The highly flexible Bachelor of Arts in Psychology program at Thompson Rivers University - Open Learning provides a thorough foundation in Psychology while allowing for a broad range of electives. The majority of lower- and upper-level Psychology courses transfer to TRU-OL, and residency requirements are minimal. This means students can take the majority of their coursework at Douglas College, then apply to the BA program at TRU-OL, transfer their credits, and finish their bachelor's degree at that institution with a semester of online courses. This option is favoured by some of our students for its ease of entry and great flexibility.

The information included on this course plan is for planning purposes and may not reflect recent changes in TRU-OL curriculum. Students should check with TRU-OL directly for degree information and advising and consult the BC transfer guide for current course transfer status. For purposes of this guide, lower-level courses are those whose course numbers start with 1 or 2, and upper-level courses are those whose course numbers start with 3 or 4.

When to transition from Douglas College to TRU-OL?

Students can apply to the TRU-OL Bachelor's degree program at any point if they meet the admission requirements. However, once admitted to TRU-OL program, there may be some limitations on your ability to take program courses at Douglas College.

Once admitted to the TRU-OL program, in order to complete a course at Douglas College and apply it toward program requirements students may require a letter of permission or need to go through another round of course transfer with attendant fees.

For the reasons above, it may be advantageous to wait to apply to TRU-OL until you have completed your Douglas College coursework. However, application processing and transfer assessment could take a number of weeks, before you can register in the TRU-OL courses you need to complete.

Thus, the optimal timing for application to the TRU-OL program may vary with the student's situation and priorities. Students may wish to consult TRU-OL program advisors for individual advice on when to apply to the program as a transfer student, to balance process complexity with time to degree completion.
