

Strong Start: New Student Orientation

This orientation program provides new students with the opportunity to explore Douglas College, learn about available services and meet other first-year students. It is designed to help you have a successful first semester here. The program includes:

- 1. DCUE 0200 Strong Start Orientation is an online course that covers all the basics of how to get ready for your first semester. You will find:
 - A new student checklist that features information on how to pay your tuition fees, get your textbooks, apply for Student ID Card and so on;
 - An overview of different student services available at Douglas College;
 - Resources for international students;
 - And more!

All new students will be automatically enrolled into this course in December. Those who complete the course by the end of the Winter semester will be entered into a draw to win a pair of Apple AirPods! To access the course:

- Log on to <u>Blackboard</u> with your College Network Access credentials (your 9-digit student number and CNA password).
- Click on "Courses".
- Click on "Strong Start Orientation" to unveil your orientation!

Understanding Academic Integrity

Douglas College expects students to adhere to the highest standards of academic integrity. To help you understand what academic integrity means at Douglas, all new students will be automatically enrolled into DCUE 0100 - Academic Integrity, an online course that lives on Blackboard. This course is mandatory and will be launched in December. Students are expected to complete the course before Winter semester begins. Students who do not complete the module with a passing grade may not be allowed to register for future semesters until it is complete. To access the course, please find "Academic Integrity" under "Courses" on Blackboard.

Class Registration and Fee Payment

(*Information in this section is applicable to domestic students only. Please refer to separate instructions provided by Douglas College International (DCI) if you are an international student.) If you still have not registered for your class, have a look through the step-by-step registration instructions. If you are on a waitlist for one or more of your classes, don't worry, there is still a chance you'll make it into the class. When you are on the waitlist, be sure to check your myAccount every day because if you are given an offer, you only have 23 hours to accept it. If you miss your offer, you will be removed from the waitlist. If you still find yourself on a waitlist on the first day of class, make sure you attend the first class to talk to the professor and indicate your interest.
