8.5 <u>Sign Language Interpreting Program</u>

Several Council Members shared feedback from their constituency groups. Discussion included:

- implications and benefits regarding co-location of the program
- commitment to Douglas College students currently in the program
- benefits to the Deaf and Hard of Hearing students and community
- increased demand for retaining qualified interpreting services
- impact on Modern Languages ASL courses housed in LLPA
- transfer of the DPSLI to VCC requires Board approval at each institution

T. Borgford confirmed that the students currently enrolled in the program would be supported through completion at Douglas College and will graduate with Douglas College credentials.

Following lengthy discussion, the Chair confirmed that the advice provided to the College Board will reflect the fullness of the discussion and the various points of view that have been expressed.

9.1 **Concept Paper: Advanced Certificate in Applied Audio**

The proposed 30 credit Advanced Certificate in Applied Audio builds on the success of the Music Technology Diploma. The courses focus on skills related to the main and emerging areas of industry demand: live audio, postproduction, game audio, mastering and immersive audio. Other courses enhance communication skills and students' ability to create audio-visual content for digital platforms, both crucial to their networking capacity and professional profile.
