## Travelling to Canada - Eligibility



#### To be able to enter Canada as a student, you must:

- have a valid study permit or a Port of entry letter of introduction (POE letter/approval letter) that shows you were approved for a study permit;
- be attending a <u>designated learning institution (DLI) with a COVID-19 readiness plan</u> approved by its province or territory (Douglas College); and
- be traveling to Canada before the "Must enter Canada by" date on your POE letter if you are travelling with your POE letter

## Travelling to Canada - Eligibility



Please note that there are various rules and guidelines at different levels:

#### Federal requirements

- Eligibility to travel to Canada
- Use of ArriveCAN
- Pre-arrival, on-arrival, and post-arrival COVID tests
- Quarantine (hotel stay and self-isolation) etc.,
- BC Provincial restrictions (varies depending on the province)
  - Daily activities what you can/cannot do

#### Douglas College requirements

- Submission of studying online agreement
- Submission of travel and self-isolation plans
- Self-isolation check-in

## Travelling to Canada



#### Use ArriveCAN to enter Canada by land and air

- As of February 22, 2021, you MUST use <u>ArriveCAN</u> BEFORE checking in at the airport or crossing the border.
- You must submit details about your contact information and quarantine plans.
- The app is used to confirm your arrival, track your quarantine, and report your COVID self-assessment.

#### General Timeline



#### Before travel

- Check if you meet eligibility to travel
- Check the government website for a recent update
- Book your flight and plan your quarantine check Douglas page for some options

2 weeks to 3 days before the trip

- Download the <u>ArriveCAN</u> and submit your quarantine plans to the Federal Government.
- Book your pre-arrival COVID test
- Book a hotel for your 3-day hotel quarantine.
- Submit your travel plans to **Douglas College** to request a travel support letter

Within 72 hrs of departure

- Take a pre-arrival COVID-19 PCR test within 72 hours of travel
- Check your in-flight COVID measures
- Register for your on-arrival test online to avoid a lineup at YVR (optional)
- Check the documents needed for your arrival and put them in your carry-on luggage
- Check what you can/cannot bring to Canada on Canada Border Services Agency website

Check-in

- Present your COVID test result and other documents requested at check-in
- Follow the guidelines at the Airport

## What if I test positive?

#### Do not pack your documents in your checked luggage!

- ✓ Valid passport that you used for your study permit application.
- ✓ Valid Temporary Resident Visa or eTA usually attached to your passport
- ✓ Valid study permit or the Port of Entry letter of introduction (POE letter/study permit approval letter) sent to you when your study permit was approved Note: Approval in Principal/AIP does now allow students to travel
- ✓ Letter of Acceptance from Douglas College
- ✓ Verification of Enrollment (VOE) printed from your myAccount
- ✓ Travel support letter from Douglas College
- ✓ Documents that proves funds available bank statement etc
- ✓ Negative COVID test result
- Details/confirmation on your quarantine plans (hotel and self-isolation)
- ✓ ArriveCAN receipt (display on your phone or printout)
- ✓ Medical Insurance information



## Proof of a negative COVID-19 test result

- proof of having a vaccine does not replace a valid test result
- take the test within 72 hours of your scheduled flight departure time for your flight that lands in Canada
- provide one of the accepted types of tests
- Airlines will refuse boarding to travellers who are unable to provide a valid molecular test result.
- keep proof of your test results for the 14-day period that begins on the day you enter Canada



## **Verification of Enrollment (VOE)**

- Official document you can print from your online Douglas College myAccount any time
- Confirms your enrollment for a specific semester

#### To print a VOE online:

- 1. Log-in to your <u>myAccount</u>
- Select "Student Records"
- Select "View/Print Documents & Letters"
- 4. Select the Verification of Enrolment document type (with or without fees)
- 5. Select a term
- 6. Click "continue"
- 7. On the window toolbar select "file" and then "print"



#### **Douglas College Travel Support Letter**

#### **How to Request the Travel Support Letter?**

- Submit your self-isolation plan to Douglas College <u>here</u>.
- Upon verification we will be able to provide a letter of support for travelling to Canada.
- Request the letter at least 2 business days in advance
- Our travel Support Letter does not guarantee your entry to Canada.
- A border services officer will make the final decision on whether you are eligible to enter Canada.



#### **Proof of funds**

- You <u>must</u> bring proof of sufficient funds to support yourself during your stay in Canada
- First-year tuition fees + living cost (CAD\$10,000) + \$3,000 to \$4,000 (additional expenses)
- You must disclose to the border officer if you arrive with more than CAD \$10,000.

## Mandatory Requirements - Entering Canada



#### Screening

All travellers will go through health check screening, no matter their country of origin.


#### Masks

You must wear a non-medical mask throughout your travel, upon arrival in Canada (including the time you are travelling from the airport to the place of your quarantine)

#### How to use the kiosks



Scan your Passport/Travel Document

Take your photo

Verify your fingerprints

Answer a few questions to complete your declaration

Take your receipt from the Kiosk

Bring the receipt to the Border Officer

#### Custom Clearance



When the border services officer greets you, they look at several factors, including:


- Your reasons for travelling to Canada
- Your funds available to support yourself in Canada
- Your ability to comply with <u>all the COVID requirements</u>, including Douglas College policies
- Timing of you arrival
  - You have time to complete your quarantine before you physically attend classes (if there is any in-person component), or
  - You can study online during your quarantine
  - If you arrive too early, the border officer can refuse your entry

Travelers within Canada may be subject to additional provincial, territorial and local public health measures.

#### Custom Clearance



Canada Border Services Agency Officers are NOT visa officers from Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada. They are like Police for the Border to make sure you...



## Immigration Office




After assessed by a border officer, you need to go to an immigration office and have your study permit printed. You have to show your POE letter here.

- Sticker in your passport, must enter before it expires;
- Usually is a multiple-entry visa;



- Linked to your passport, so travel with the passport you used for your application
- Valid for 5 years or until your passport expiry

## Study Permit






The <u>study permit</u> is a document issued by IRCC (Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada) that allows <u>foreign nationals (YOU)</u> to stay and study at <u>designated learning institutions</u> (i.e. Douglas College) in Canada until the expiry of your authorized stay.

## Study permit - What to check?





 May work 20 hrs per week offcampus or full-time during regular breaks if meeting criteria outlined in section 186(v) of IRPR.

OI

 May accept employment on or off campus if meeting eligibility criteria as per <u>R186(f)</u>, <u>(v) or (w)</u>. Must cease working if no longer meeting these criteria.

## Important reminders:



- Be prepared to spend a few hours at the airport.
  - The wait at Immigration and Customs area could be long
- The CBSA no longer stamps passports at airports.
  - If you need an entry stamp, you must request from a border services officer after completing a kiosk transaction.
- Once your study permit is issued, <u>check the details</u> on your study permit before you leave the office.
  - Your personal information, Eligibility to work (for academic programs), Remarks etc.
  - If you notice an error, notify the officer before you leave!

## Quarantine Plan and Requirements



- When you arrive in Canada by <u>air, land or sea</u> your health will be assessed.
- You must go through <u>on-arrival</u> and <u>Day-10 COVID tests</u> in Canada
- You must stay for 3 days at <u>one of Government approved</u> hotels while waiting for the result of the arrival test
- You must have a plan to quarantine for the remaining 11 days.
   Check for the guidelines on <u>BC Centre of Disease Control</u> website
- If you do not have <u>a quarantine plan</u>, you may not be allowed to enter Canada.
- Quarantine is mandatory even if you have no symptoms!

### Arrival to Quarantine



#### On Arrival

- Go through Immigration and Customs
- Obtain a Study Permit at Immigration office
- On-arrival COVID test at the Airport and pick up the Day-10 test kit
- Communicate with the hotel to travel for 3-day hotel stay

#### Hotel stay

- Follow the rules at the hotel
- Receive the on-arrival test result via email
- Respond to Douglas College quarantine check-in
- Check the wifi and join the class if the semester has started

#### Selfisolation

- Complete Day-4 to Day-14 quarantine at your quarantine location
- Respond to Douglas College quarantine check-in
- Follow all the quarantine rules
- Take the Day-10 COVID test (the instructions in the kit)
- Check BC COVID guidelines

## Where to stay from Day-4 for quarantine?



- Douglas College has contacted a few Metro Vancouver hotels that might be able to accommodate Douglas International Students. Rates and availability are subject to change without notice.
- For a list, visit "Travelling to Canada" page on our website.
- To receive the lowest available rate please state that you are a Douglas College international student.

## Quick summary



#### **3 COVID tests**

- 72 hours before your flight to Canada
- On-arrival at the airport
- Day-10 after your arrival
- → You are responsible for the pre-departure test

#### 2 quarantine locations after arrival

- Day-1 to Day-3 at a Government approved hotel
- Day-4 to Day-14 at your quarantine location
- → Your responsibility to secure locations and pay for the cost

#### 1 app for your travel to Canada

- Download ArriveCAN
- Report your travel plans and COVID symptom to the Government

#### Penalties



# Not following instructions or not providing accurate information result in penalties

#### such as:

- Tickets up to \$3,000
- Fine of up to \$750,000
- 6 months in prison
- Being found <u>inadmissible</u>, removed from Canada

The Government is getting tighter with the rules

### **Quarantine 101**



#### Calculation of your quarantine period

- Your quarantine period begins on the day that you arrive in Canada.
- For example, if you arrive at 11:50 pm on Thursday, October 1, then Thursday is considered day 1 of your quarantine period. Your quarantine period would end 14 days later, on Wednesday, October 14.

#### **During the self-isolation period**

- Staff from the International office will check-in for the first 4 days, and then every other day until day 14.
- You are required to reply to the check-ins and update us on your health conditions.
- Failed to reply to the check-in could result on reporting the student to the health authorities.



#### **Guard.me for New International Students**



#### What is Guard.me



- Guard.me is temporary private health insurance to cover you while you are waiting to be eligible for MSP.
- First semester international students at Douglas College are charged \$189.00.
   This coverage starts on their first day of class, May 10, 2021.
- Additional coverage may be purchased for early arrivals or family members.
- Go to our <u>medical insurance page</u> for more information.

#### When will I receive my Guard.me card?

 New international students will receive their insurance cards after the add/drop date of each semester, May 26, 2020.

## **BC Medical Service plan (MSP)**



- Medical Insurance is mandatory while you study in Canada.
- Upon arrival in BC you must apply for MSP. You can apply online.
- MSP covers doctor visits, hospital visits, and medically required services.
   See the <u>list of medical</u> <u>services</u> that MSP covers.
- \$75.00/month per student.
- Your coverage may <u>start three months</u> <u>after your arrival date in British</u> Columbia.

#### **DSU Health and Dental Plan**




#### **Coverage period**

- If you start your studies at Douglas in Summer semester: Not covered during the Summer Session
- In Fall semester: Covered for one year, from September 1 to August 31

#### **Approximate Cost**

Starting from September: \$250 for one year.
