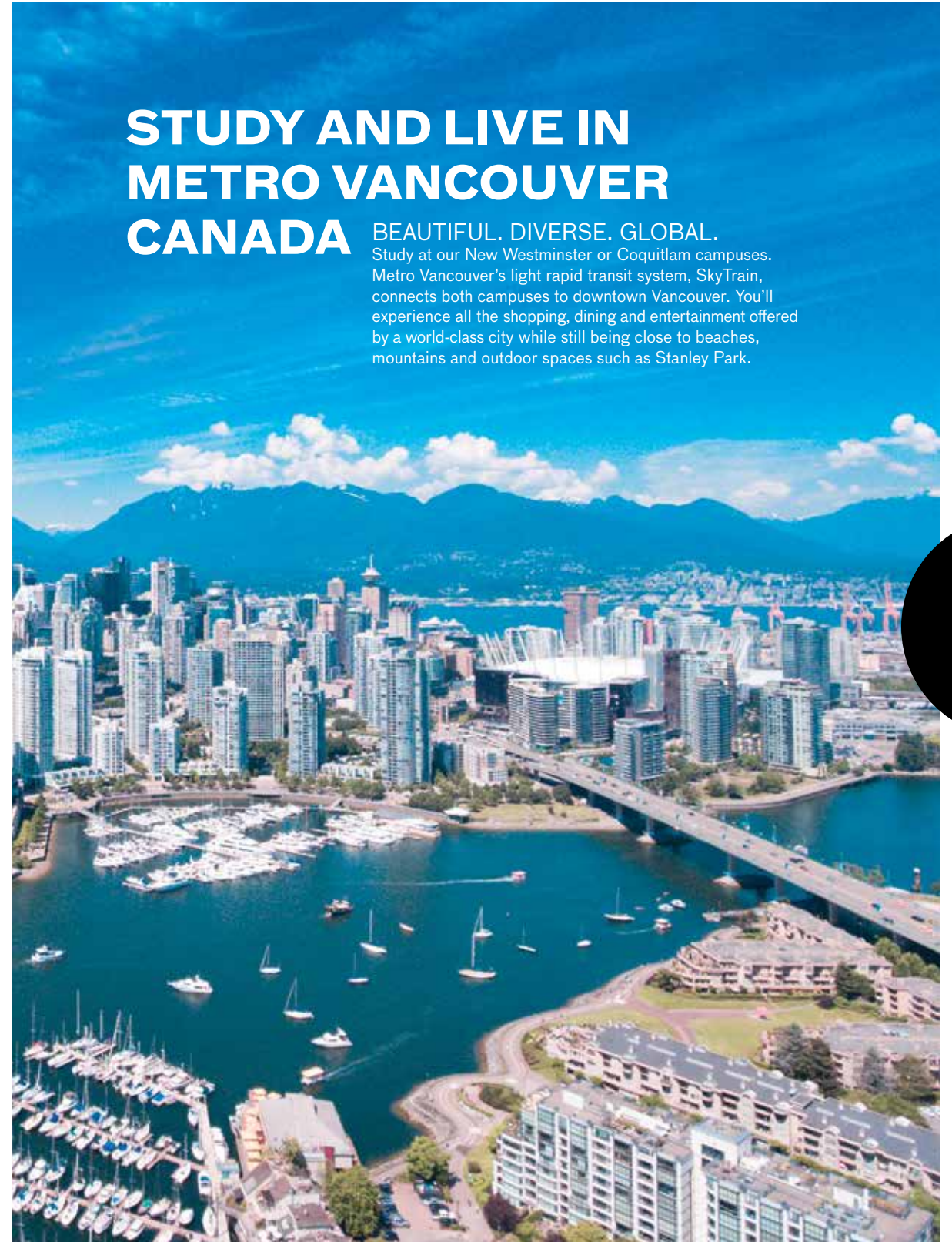
Metro Vancouver transit map..... 35

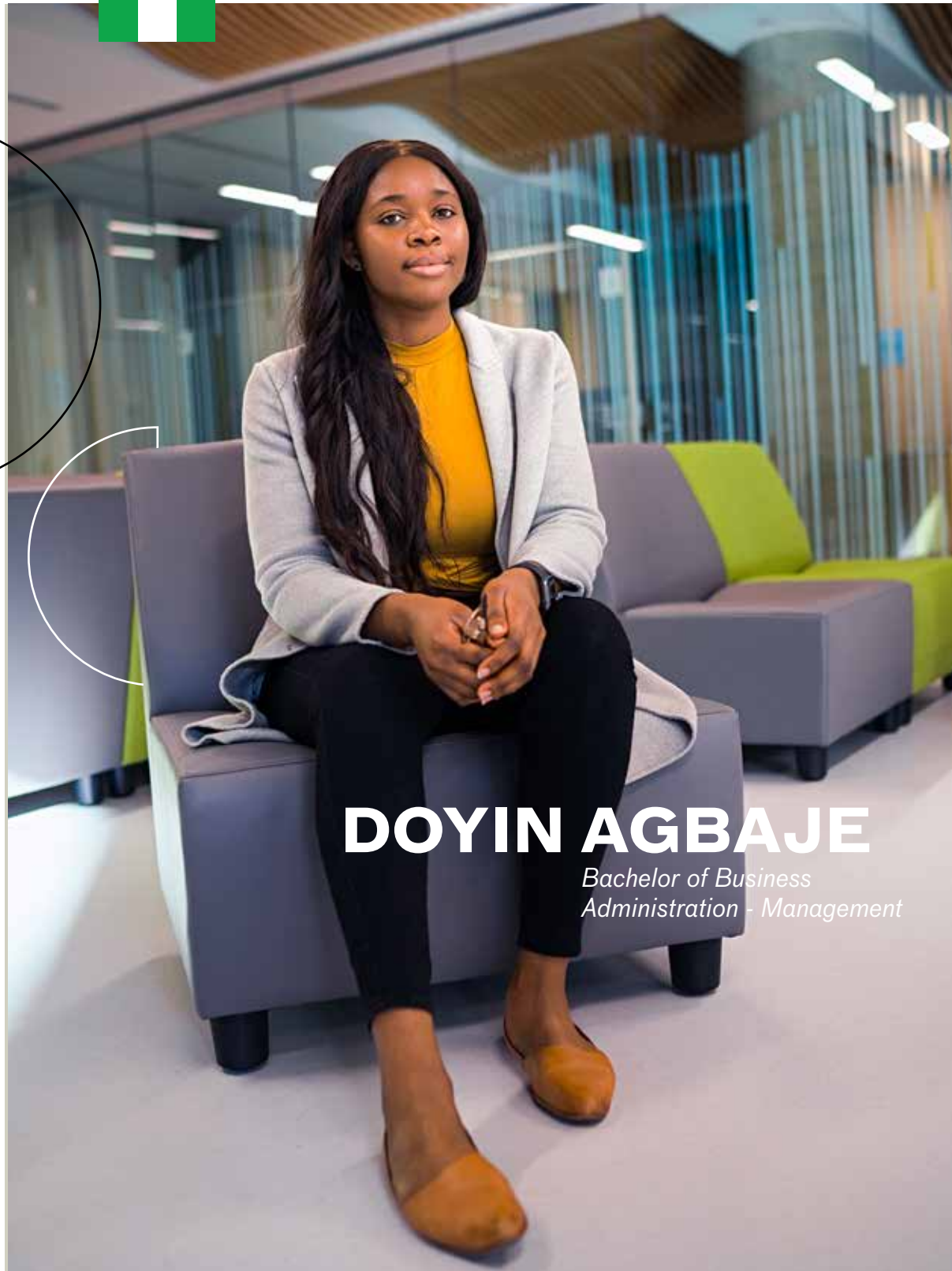

GETTING DOWN TO BUSINESS

Doyin hadn't originally planned on getting her bachelor's degree at Douglas. When she arrived in Canada from Nigeria, she decided to complete a Commerce and Business Administration diploma and then transfer to Simon Fraser University. But beyond that, her goals were hazy.

"Ever since high school I knew that I wanted to do a business program, but I couldn't pinpoint exactly what to focus on," she says. "The diploma gave me the big picture – it allowed me to explore all aspects of business."

When it came time to transfer, Doyin realized the high cost of tuition meant university wasn't an option. So she stayed at Douglas – and thrived. By the time she completed her diploma, Doyin had already received the Student Leader of the Year award, served as the student representative on two different College governance bodies and was voted in as the Director of College Relations with the Douglas Students' Union.

She also gained clarity about what aspect of business she wanted to focus on, and discovered Douglas had the exact program to get her there: the Bachelor of Business Administration in Management with a specialization in International Business. Now that Doyin has graduated, she wants to combine the skills she gained in her program with those she developed in the Douglas community to pursue a Master of Public Policy and build a career in policy or politics.

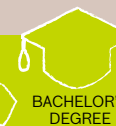

KICKSTARTING HIS CAREER

Rahul came to Canada in hopes of gaining hands-on experience to stand out to potential employers. That's just what he got through the Diploma in Computing Studies and Information Systems (CSIS).

"Compared to India, I have gotten more practical learning experiences coming to Canada and studying at Douglas," he says. "Being evaluated on coding instead of large exams allowed me to put more focus into improving my skills, which has helped me succeed in my career."

While Rahul was completing his diploma, his instructors encouraged him to apply for IT jobs instead of continuing to work part-time in the fast-food industry. "I initially applied for an office assistant position with a real estate company, but the owner of the company saw all the technical skills on my resume and offered me the IT manager position instead," he says.

Working while studying allowed Rahul to broaden his connections early and apply his industry knowledge to his coursework. He also became a student lab assistant within the CSIS program, furthering his own knowledge while helping his peers.

"Time management, networking and practical learning like coding and database management were some of the main things that made it possible for me to succeed in my career post-graduation," he says.

Anastasiia is vocal about global issues like women's rights, gender-based discrimination and harassment. She wants a career where she can make a measurable impact, and says Douglas was the obvious choice for her studies. "The Associate of Arts Degree in Communications gave me a lot of freedom in tailoring my curriculum."

Once she started at Douglas, she discovered the value of real-world learning experiences. "In one of my first-year courses, the instructor assigned us to research labour market trends for new communications professionals. I managed to get an interview with the head of a major Vancouver PR firm and gained exclusive knowledge for my paper." The project challenged Anastasiia, allowing her to break her "fear barrier" and learn new skills. "I love how Douglas College gives students the opportunity to get out of their comfort zone and explore their capabilities," she says.

Anastasiia is taking a year to work and plan her future, and has been able to bring these communications, critical thinking and research skills into her current position as a medical office assistant.

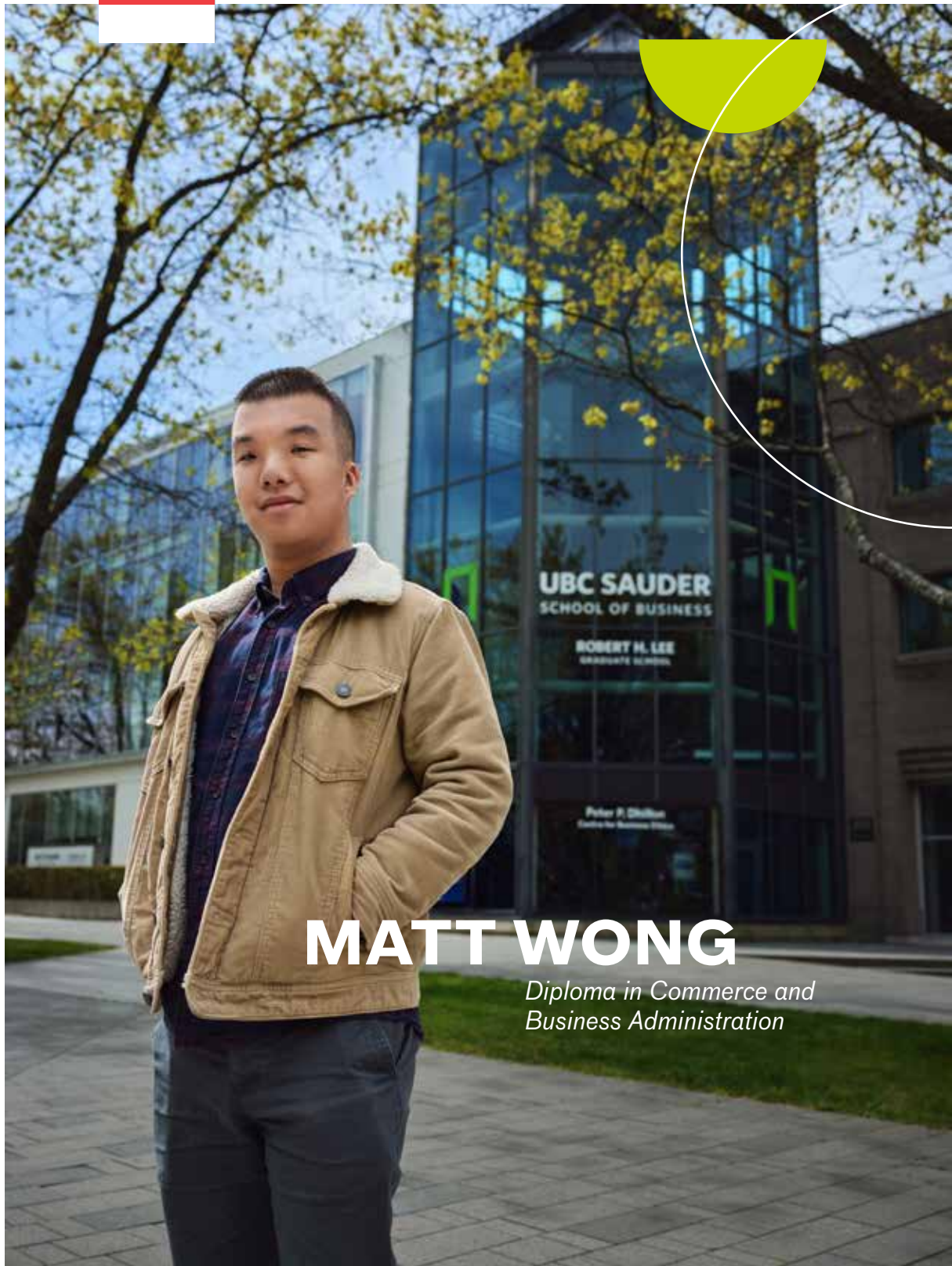

A SMOOTH TRANSITION

Matt had set his sights on UBC's Commerce program, but was anxious about the heavy workload and larger class sizes. That's when he started looking into the option of university transfer through Douglas College. "I got the best feeling about Douglas," he says. "I knew that working closely with professors and having smaller class sizes would make transitioning to university a lot easier."

Matt enrolled in the Diploma in Commerce and Business Administration and used all the resources available to him at Douglas to make sure he was taking the right courses to transfer. "I stayed on track by using myPath, the BC Transfer Guide and talking to student advisors every semester."

From the beginning of his studies, Matt's goal was always to transfer to UBC, and he appreciates the support Douglas provided to help him get there.

"Douglas gave me a solid foundation for learning in Canadian institutions," he says. "The practical teaching styles and smaller class sizes that allowed me to interact with my instructors made it easier for me to interact with professors at UBC."

Matt is now busy completing his final year in the Bachelor of Commerce program at UBC's Sauder School of Business, with the goal of pursuing a career in marketing after graduation.

TRANSFER TO A TOP UNIVERSITY

Take the first half of your bachelor's degree at Douglas College. 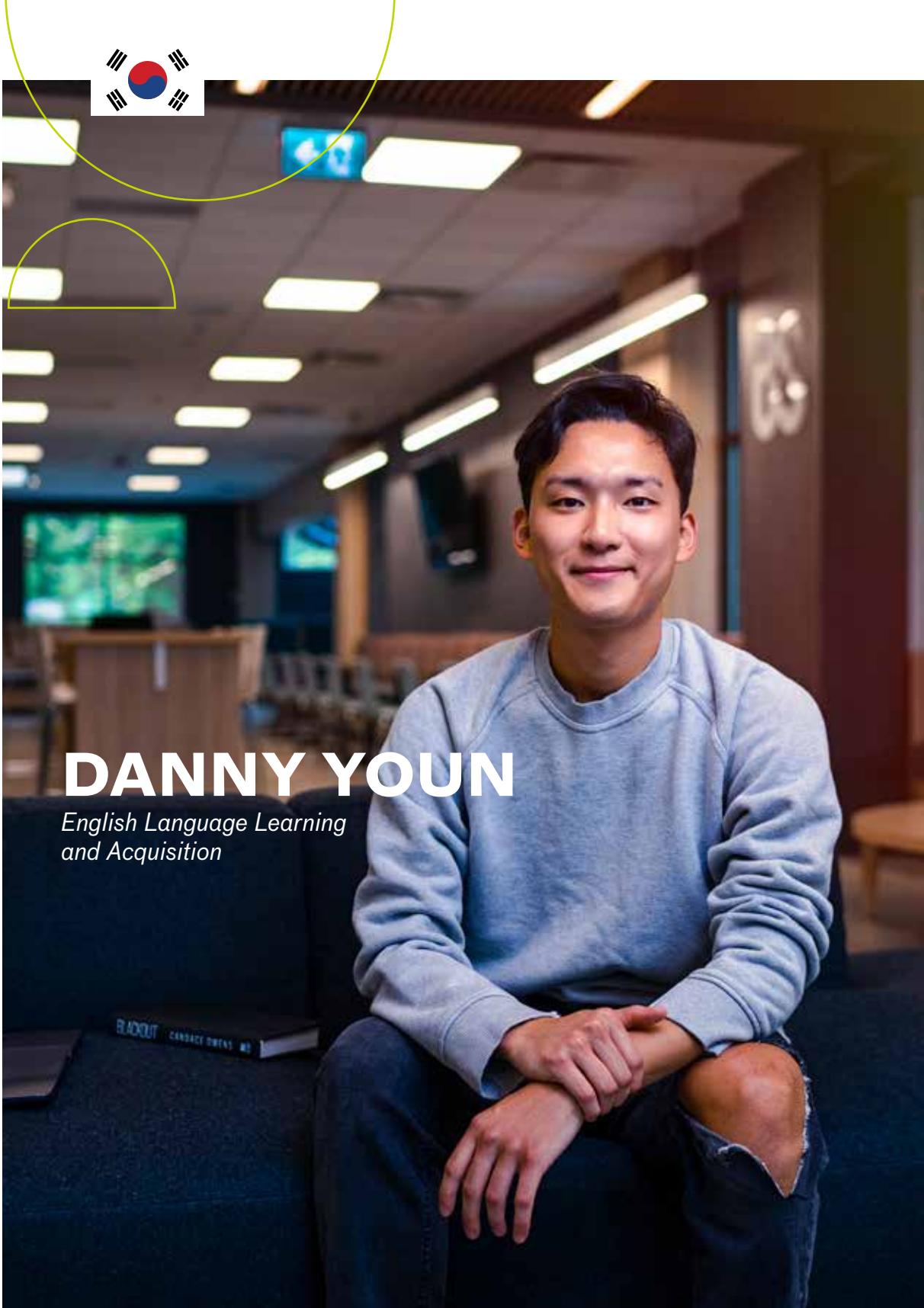

PURSUIING HIS DREAM

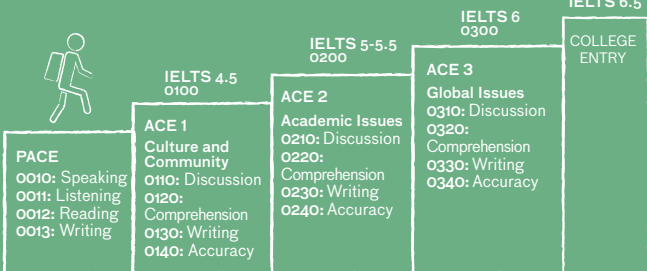
Like many international students, Danny first came to Canada as a teenager. He spent two years in high school in Victoria, B.C., and eventually applied to the Associate of Arts in Economics program at Douglas. That's when he discovered he needed to improve his English skills in order to be admitted to college-level courses. Luckily, he could do that right at Douglas with the English Language Learning and Acquisition (ELLA) program. "I was surprised that I needed additional English help," he says. "I studied English in Korea. I had private lessons in learning, reading and writing." Once he started going through the program, however, he noticed a change. "The English used in college classes is totally different from what I learned in Korea. ELLA improved my English a lot. It made my writing and speech more concise." Upgrading his English through ELLA provided him with the confidence to switch to the Hospitality Management program, with hopes of fulfilling his dream of owning a hotel. His improved English has also helped him get experience in the hospitality industry as a server. "I can now have proper and professional conversations with guests."

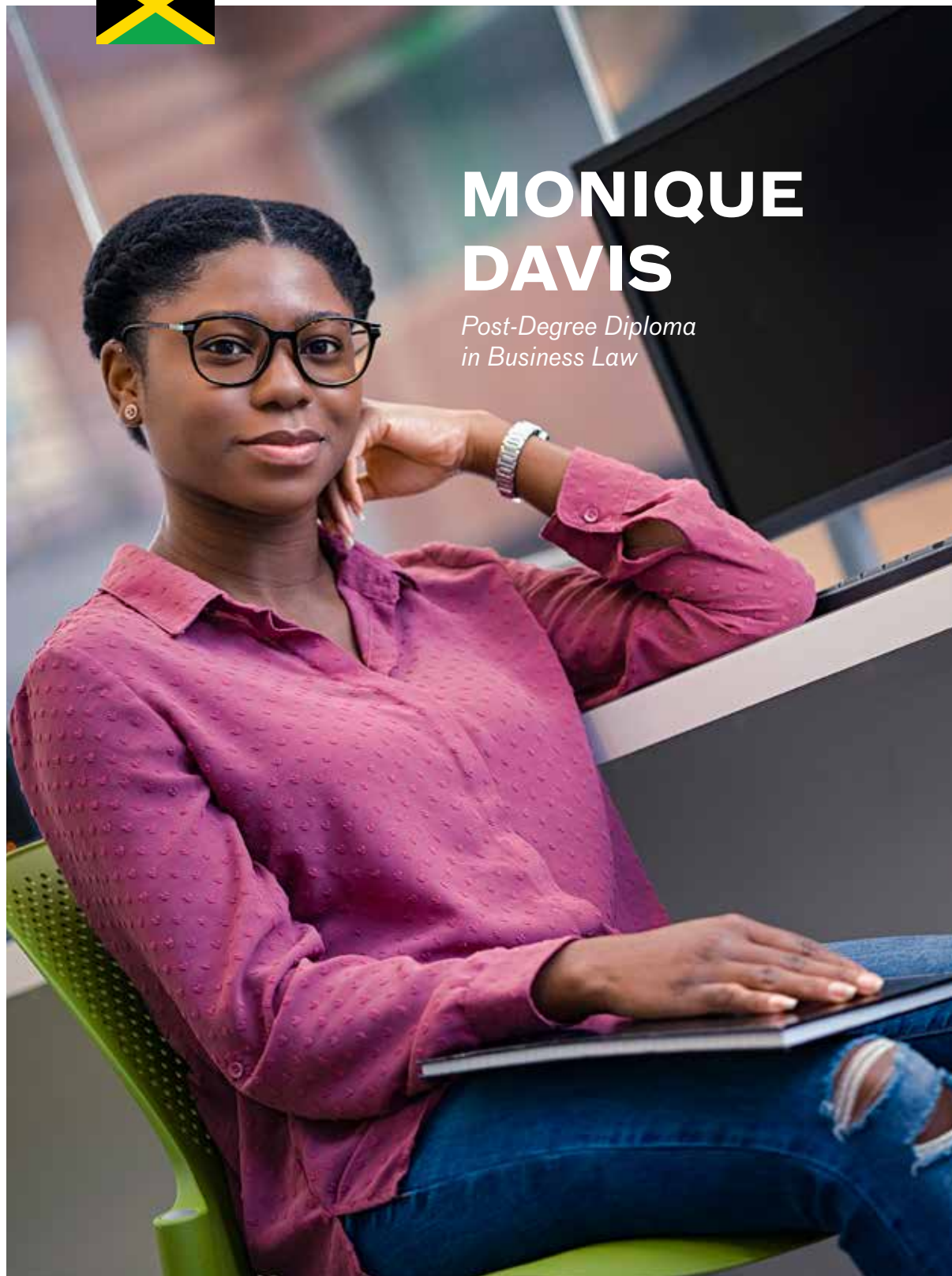

BOOSTING HER CAREER

A chance meeting put Monique on the path to success. While hosting a booth at a campus event at Douglas, Monique – who was a student in the Post-Degree Diploma in Business Law – was approached by a career counsellor who invited her to a Career Boost presentation. “That session made me passionate about my career growth,” she says. “The sessions were inclusive, and the focus was on progress for everyone no matter your level of experience. Everyone shared their opinions and received feedback while gaining a wealth of knowledge and resources.”

Designed specifically for post-degree program students, Career Boost provides six mandatory workshops covering a range of topics, such as improving your communication skills, updating your LinkedIn profile, networking and building your resumé and cover letter. Monique landed a part-time job while still a student; she credits her Career Boost coaches for helping her improve her confidence in tackling job interviews, as well showing her how to create a targeted cover letter and resumé. Now that she has graduated, Monique will be searching for a job in her field with the continued support of the Career Centre, which provides ongoing use of all services to Douglas alumni.

"I tell this to everybody, if you're a new student, do EDGE because that's where you'll find friends for life," she says. Myat found EDGE so energizing that she took on a leadership position at the following year's event.

Myat also found inspiration in the board game and philosophy clubs she was a part of, so much so that she decided to create her own club. "I formed a Burmese club in the second year to create cultural connections," she says. "People from Myanmar and other countries can sit down together, eat chips and play games. I've had the opportunity to teach people about my country while learning about the cultures of my peers."

But it was in her role as a SWAN leader where she found a strong connection between her on-campus involvement and her area of study.

"Much of what we cover in the Child and Youth Care program involves mental health and wellness," she says. "Now, I can bring my knowledge from being a student wellness leader into the classroom and use what I've learned about breaking down mental health stigmas to become a better leader."

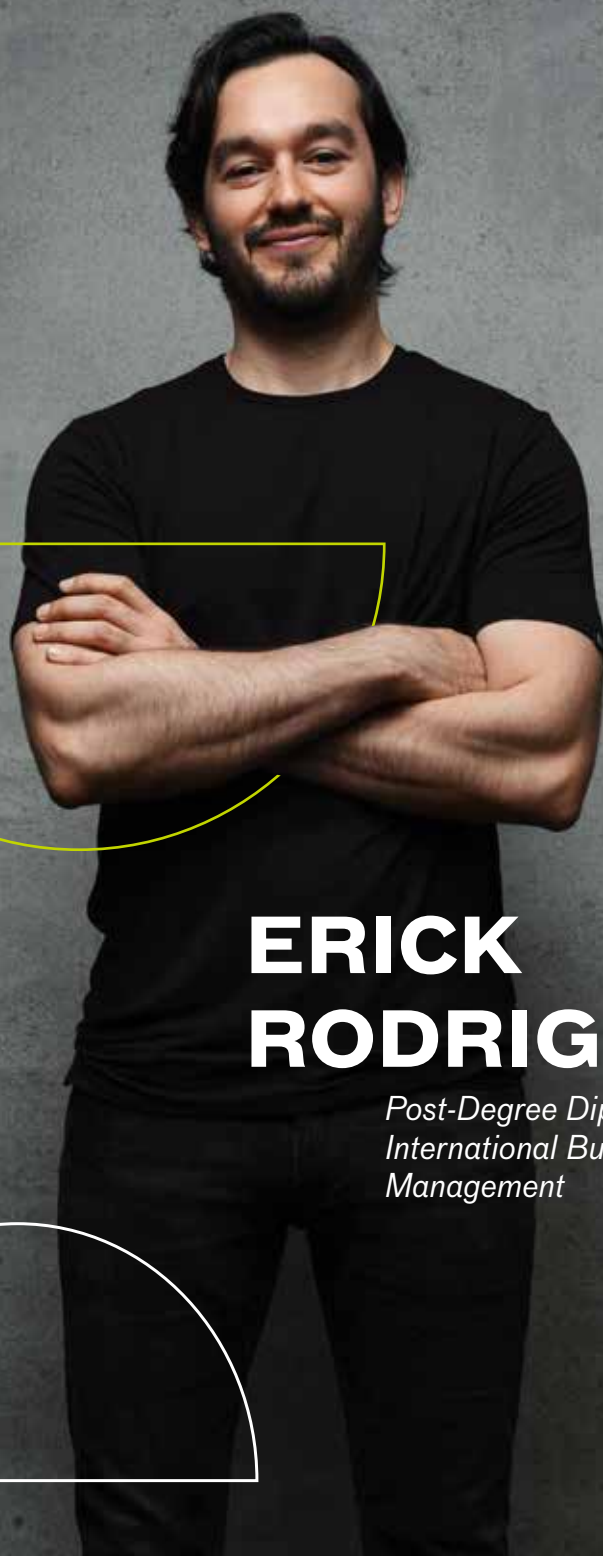

STRIVING FOR SUSTAINABILITY

Erick developed a fondness for British Columbia when he first visited Squamish as a teenager. He was drawn to the snow-peaked mountains, lush forests and vast oceans – a landscape that stayed with him when he returned to Mexico.

In 2017, Erick and his sister created the sustainable clothing company Elementa. “We started manufacturing bamboo fabric t-shirts. We imported the fabric and outsourced a factory in Mexico to create our designs,” he explains.

Erick then decided to continue his education in Canada with the Post-Degree Diploma in International Business Management at Douglas College. “My dream of going back to Canada was always present. I always tried to connect in ways that would allow me to move abroad.” Since completing his first diploma, Erick has been working toward his Post-Degree Diploma in Marketing to further his business communications skills.

Staying in Canada means evolving his business in an industry that aligns with his values. “There are a lot of opportunities in this country, and a market that’s very interested in what the future of clothing is going to be,” he says. “If we mix that with what’s already happened with companies like Lululemon and Arc’teryx, I think there’s something very impactful that could happen here.”

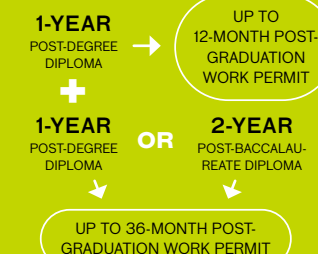

WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN CREDENTIALS?

- Certificate:** Up to one year of full-time study.
- Diploma:** Typically two years of full-time study.
- Associate degree:** Two years of university transfer courses in the arts or sciences. Credits can be transferred to bachelor's degree programs at B.C. universities from recognized B.C. colleges.
- Bachelor's degree:** Usually requires four years of study. Students can gain specialization in one subject area through a major or honours program.
- Master's degree:** Typically requires two additional years beyond a bachelor's degree. Offers the option to enhance skills and knowledge through coursework and independent research. Not offered at Douglas.
- Doctoral degree (PhD):** Typically requires four to seven additional years beyond a master's degree and is the highest level of academic achievement. Not offered at Douglas.

GETTING REWARDED FOR GIVING BACK

Quoc has been passionate about helping others since he was in high school, volunteering at events like the Lunar New Year celebration for the Vietnamese community in Vancouver. When Quoc was applying for the Associate of Science program at Douglas, he saw a reminder to apply for scholarships and awards on the College's website and realized that his volunteer work could help him pay for his education. "I was lucky enough to receive an International Entrance Scholarship through my community contribution and good academic performance," he says.

Quoc continued to volunteer during his time at Douglas. "I participate in the mentorship program to help new international students," he says. "If they have questions, then I can answer or direct them to the right department." Quoc was recently accepted into the Bachelor of Science program at UBC, and is grateful that Douglas' financial support paved the way for his success. "It helped me a lot," he says. "Because I got this scholarship I felt less pressure to pay tuition and it allowed me to focus more on studying instead of working."

ACADEMIC PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

Undergraduate (diploma, certificate, associate and bachelor's degree) programs:

High school graduation and minimum 17 years of age by the first day of class; and

Minimum overall grade average of "C" or 60% or equivalent in the final year of high school; and

Minimum final grade of "C" or 60% in Grade 11 Mathematics or equivalent for most programs.

Post-degree and post-baccalaureate programs:

Graduation from a recognized degree-granting post-secondary institution with a minimum 3-year bachelor's degree; and

Minimum cumulative grade average of "C" or 60% or equivalent during bachelor's degree program.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

You are required to demonstrate proficiency in the English language prior to admission to Douglas College. You can do so by providing proof of one of the following (other acceptable substitutes may also be considered):

English studies 12 in B.C. high school, minimum grade "C" (based on course grade and provincial exam).

TOEFL: IBT minimum score 83; Douglas College's institutional code is 9568.

IELTS (Academic Module): minimum overall score 6.5. For post-degree and post-baccalaureate diploma programs, minimum score of 6.0 for each band. Note: IELTS General is not accepted.

Successful completion of four courses at ACE Level 2 and three courses at ACE Level 3 at Douglas College.

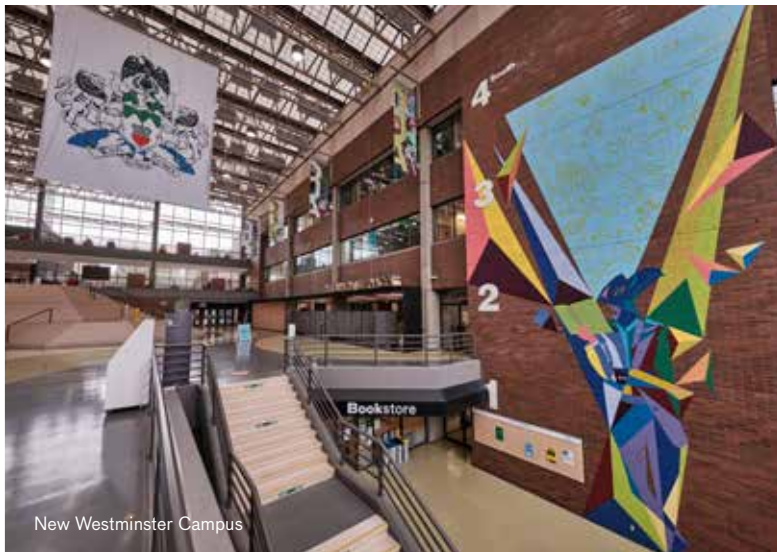

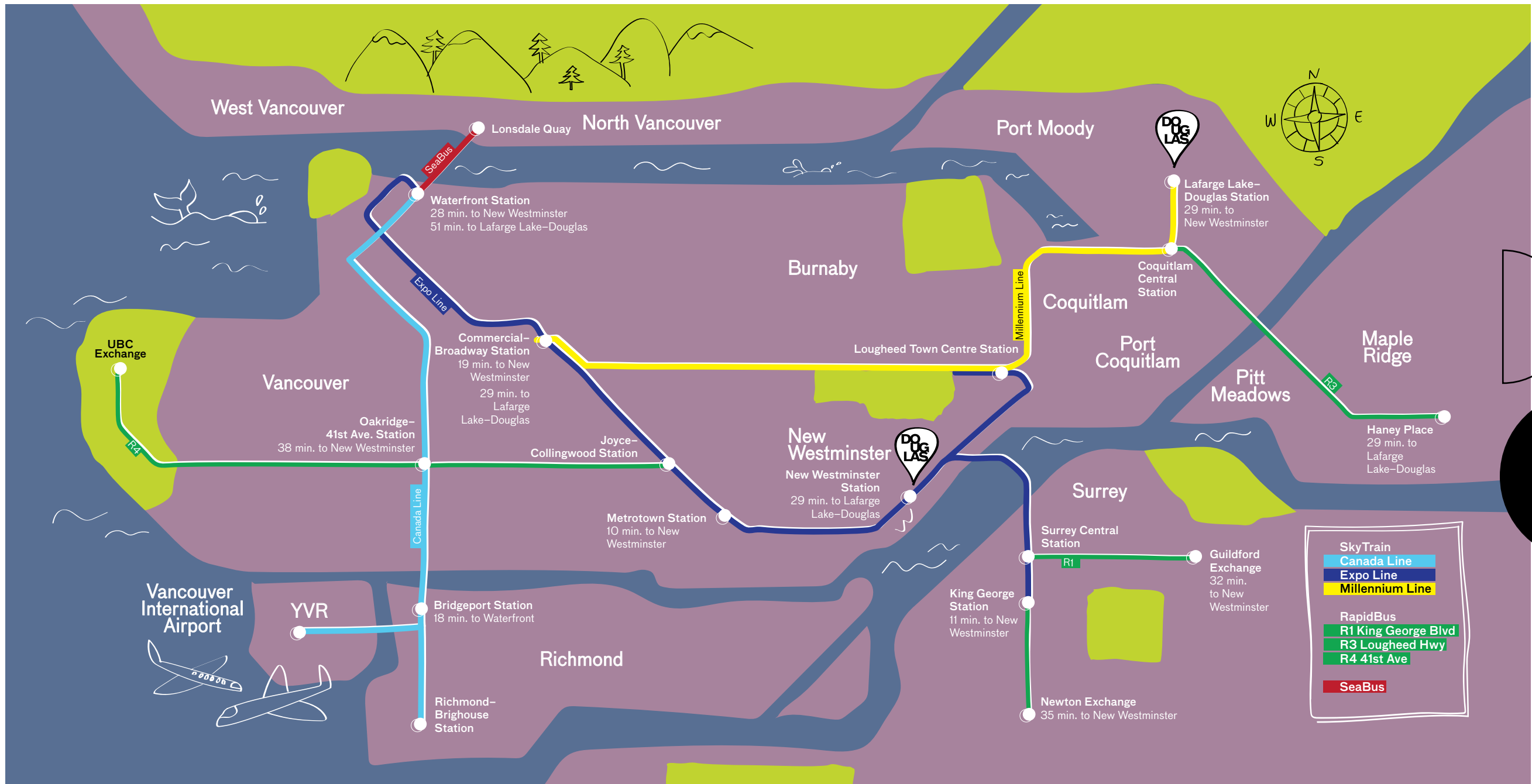

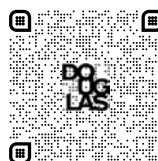
