ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

ACADEMIC PROGRAM REQUIREMENTS

Undergraduate (diploma, certificate, associate and bachelor's degree) programs:

- High school graduation and minimum 17 years of age by the end of the first month of studies;
- Minimum overall grade average of "C" or 60% or equivalent in the final year of high school; and
- Minimum final grade of "C" or 60% in Grade 11 Mathematics or equivalent for most programs; OR
- Cambridge curriculum: 4 O-level subjects at "C" grade + 2 A-level subjects (or 4 AS-level) at "D" grade
- International Baccalaureate (IB): A minimum of 18 points across 6 subjects.

Post-degree and post-baccalaureate programs:

- Graduation from a recognized degree-granting post-secondary institution with a minimum 3-year bachelor's degree; and
- Minimum cumulative grade average of "C" or 60% or equivalent during bachelor's degree program.

ENGLISH LANGUAGE REQUIREMENTS

You are required to demonstrate proficiency in the English language prior to admission to Douglas College. You can do so by providing proof of one of the following (other factors may also be considered):

- B.C. high school English 12: minimum grade "C" or equivalent
- IB English Language (SL or HL): minimum grade 3
- TOEFL: iBT with a minimum score of 83 (21 in writing for Post-Degree and Post-Baccalaureate programs); Douglas College's institution code is 9568
- TOEFL Essentials: minimum score of 9 (no score below 8 on any individual section)
- IELTS (Academic Module): minimum overall score 6.5. For post-degree and post-baccalaureate diploma programs, minimum score of 6.0 for each band
- Duolingo 110
- PTE 56
- Successful completion of four courses at ACE Level 2 and three courses at ACE Level 3 at Douglas College

Note: If you don't meet the English language requirement, you may apply to the English Language Learning and Acquisition program or one of the ESL Pathway partners.

Other admission requirements such as portfolio submission, audition and volunteering experience are required in some programs.

1 Apply online through Education Planner BC and submit the \$100 application fee: educationplannerbc.ca.

2 Prepare copies of your transcripts, proof of English proficiency and a valid passport. Upload all documents on your Education Planner BC account.

APPLICATION OPENING AND DEADLINES

Some limited-enrolment programs may fill before the deadline, while open-enrolment programs stay open until seats are filled. Applying early is strongly encouraged to allow time for your study permit, credit transfer and entrance scholarship application.
