Flying to Canada checklist

If you are not sure where to start, you can start at:

- Target your arrival 4 weeks before the Fall semester starts, at earliest
- Flying to Canada checklist a chronological checklist to plan your trip to Canada

Latest update from July 19th



- Flight Ban from India has been extended until August 21, 2021.
- The Government emphasizes on having a 14-day quarantine plan for ALL travelers and submit the plan via ArriveCAN.
- On August 9, new measures will be introduced for international students
 - End of the 3-day hotel quarantine after 12:01 am EDT on Aug 9, 2021.
 - Non-vaccinated travelers must quarantine at the hotel for 3 days until then.
 - Non-vaccinated travelers must go thorough on-arrival and day-8 tests, but fully vaccinated travelers would be switched to random testing.
 - Those recovered from COVID-19 but still test positive may submit the positive test result taken 14-180 days prior to their arrival.
- 5 more Canadian Airports will open for international travel on August 9.
- Possibly more flexibilities on traveling after September 7 (TBD).

Travelling to Canada - Eligibility



To be able to enter Canada as a student, you must:

- be travelling to Canada to study;
- be attending a <u>designated learning institution (DLI) with a COVID-19 readiness plan</u> approved by its province or territory (Douglas College);
- have a valid study permit or a Port of entry letter of introduction (POE letter/approval letter) that shows you were approved for a study permit;
- be traveling to Canada before the "Must enter Canada by" date on your POE letter if you are travelling with your POE letter; and
- be travelling to Canada while the medical exam is valid (only for those who underwent the medical exam for their study permit application)

Travelling to Canada - Eligibility



Please note that there are various rules and guidelines at different levels:

• Federal requirements

- Eligibility to travel to Canada
- Use of ArriveCAN
- Pre-arrival, on-arrival, and post-arrival COVID tests
- Quarantine (hotel stay and self-isolation) etc.,

• **BC Provincial restrictions** (varies depending on the province)

• Provincial restrictions are easing up, but you want to still keep in mind of them

Douglas College requirements

- Submission of Study Permit Confirmation survey
- Submission of travel and self-isolation plans
- Self-isolation check-in

Travelling to Canada - Eligibility



Use ArriveCAN to enter Canada by land and air

- You MUST submit details via <u>ArriveCAN</u> BEFORE checking in at the airport or crossing the land border.
- You must submit details about your contact information, flight information, quarantine plans, etc.
- The app is used to confirm your arrival, track your quarantine, and report your COVID self-assessment.

Are you fully vaccinated?



You must meet ALL the requirements to be considered "fully vaccinated"

- Met eligibility to travel to Canada
- Are asymptomatic
- Received full series of one of accepted COVID-19 vaccines or a combination of them

Accepted vaccines:

- Pfizer-BioNTech COVID-19 vaccine
- Moderna COVID-19 vaccine
- AstraZeneca/COVISHIELD COVID-19 vaccine
- Janssen (Johnson & Johnson) COVID-19 vaccine single dose
- Received your last dose at least 14 days before the day you enter Canada
- Upload the proof of vaccination in ArriveCan the proof has to be either English or French

Are you fully vaccinated?



If you are fully vaccinated, you MAY BE exempted from:

- 3-day stay at one of Government approved hotels
- Day-8 testing
- 14 day quarantine

→The decision is made by the Border Officer upon entry. Douglas College is not able to confirm whether you are exempt or not. You are still required to have your 14-day quarantine plan for your arrival and submit the plan via ArriveCAN.

Even if you are vaccinated, you are still expected to:

- follow local public health measures (if any)
- wear a mask for 14 days while in public
- maintain a list of all close contacts for your first 14 days in Canada
- keep copies of your proof of vaccination for 14 days



If you are not fully vaccinated,

- When you arrive in Canada by <u>air, land or sea, your health will be</u> assessed
- You must go through <u>on-arrival</u> and <u>Day-8 COVID tests</u> in Canada
- You must stay for 3 days at <u>one of Government approved hotels</u> while waiting for the result of the arrival test
- You must quarantine for the remaining 11 days. Check for the guidelines on <u>BC Centre of Disease Control website</u> and <u>IRCC website</u>
- If you do not have a quarantine plan, you may not be allowed to enter Canada.
- Quarantine is mandatory even if you have no symptoms

General Timeline



 Check if you meet eligibility to travel Before • Check the government website for a recent update travel • Book your flight and plan your quarantine – check Douglas page for some options • Submit your travel plans to Douglas College to request a travel support letter (please submit at least 2 business days before your departure) 2 weeks to 3 • Download the ArriveCAN and submit your quarantine plans to the Federal Government. days before the trip Book your pre-arrival COVID test Book a hotel for your 3-day hotel guarantine (if applicable) • Take a pre-arrival COVID-19 PCR test within 72 hours of travel Check your in-flight COVID measures Within 72 hrs • Register for your on-arrival test online to avoid a lineup at YVR (optional) of departure • Check the documents needed for your arrival and put them in your carry-on luggage Check what you can/cannot bring to Canada on Canada Border Services Agency website • Present your COVID test result and other documents requested at check-in Airport Check-in • Follow the guidelines at the Airport



DO NOT pack your documents in your checked luggage!

- Valid passport that you used for your study permit application
- ✓ Valid Temporary Resident Visa or eTA usually attached to your passport
- Valid study permit or the Port of Entry letter of introduction (POE letter/study permit approval letter) Note: Approval in Principal/AIP does not allow students to travel
- Letter of Acceptance (LOA) from Douglas College (bring all LOAs you have)
- ✓ Verification of Enrollment (VOE) printed from your myAccount
- Travel support letter from Douglas College
- Documents that proves funds available bank statement etc
- ✓ Negative COVID test result you took within 72 hours of your departure
- Proof of Vaccination (if applicable)
- Details/confirmation on your quarantine plans (hotel and self-isolation if applicable)
- ArriveCAN receipt (display on your phone or printout)
- Medical Insurance information

Verification of Enrollment (VOE)

- Official document you can print from your online Douglas College myAccount any time
- Confirms your enrollment for a specific semester

To print a VOE online:

- 1. Log-in to your <u>myAccount</u>
- 2. Select "Student Records"
- 3. Select "View/Print Documents & Letters"
- 4. Select the Verification of Enrolment document type (with or without fees)
- 5. Select a term
- 6. Click "continue"
- 7. On the window toolbar select "file" and then "print"



Douglas College Travel Support Letter

How to Request the Travel Support Letter?

- Submit your self-isolation plan to Douglas College <u>here</u>.
- Upon verification we will be able to provide a letter of support for travelling to Canada.
- Request the letter at least 2 business days in advance
- Our travel Support Letter **does not guarantee** your entry to Canada.
- A border services officer will make the final decision on whether you are eligible to enter Canada.

Proof of funds

- You <u>must</u> bring proof of sufficient funds to support yourself during your stay in Canada
- First-year tuition fees + living cost (CAD\$10,000) + \$3,000 to \$4,000 (additional expenses)
- You **must** disclose to the border officer if you arrive with more than **CAD \$10,000.**

Mandatory Requirements - Entering Canada

Screening


All travellers will go through health check screening, no matter their country of origin.

Masks

You **must** wear a non-medical mask throughout your travel, upon arrival in Canada (including the time you are travelling from the airport to the place of your quarantine)

How to use the kiosks



- Scan your Passport/Travel Document
- Take your photo
- Verify your fingerprints
- Answer a few questions to complete your declaration
- Take your receipt from the Kiosk
- Bring the receipt to the Border Officer

Custom Clearance

When the Border officers greet you, they look at several factors, including:


- Your reasons for travelling to Canada
- Your funds available to support yourself in Canada
- Your ability to comply with <u>all the COVID requirements</u>, including Douglas College policies
- Timing of you arrival
 - You have time to complete your quarantine before you physically attend classes (if there is any in-person component), or
 - You can study online during your quarantine
 - If you arrive too early, the border officer can question or refuse your entry

Canada Border Services Agency Officers are NOT visa officers from Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada. They are like Police for the Border. Make sure you are respectful and honest.




After assessed by a border officer, you need to go to an immigration office and have your study permit printed. You have to show your POE letter here.

The <u>study permit</u> is a document issued by IRCC (Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada) that allows <u>foreign</u> <u>nationals (YOU)</u> to stay and study at <u>designated learning institutions</u> (i.e. Douglas College) in Canada until the expiry of your authorized stay.

Study permit – What to check?



• May work 20 hrs per week offcampus or full-time during regular breaks if meeting criteria outlined in section <u>186(v)</u> of IRPR.

or

 May accept employment on or off campus if meeting eligibility criteria as per <u>R186(f), (v) or (w)</u>. Must cease working if no longer meeting these criteria.




Important reminders:



- Be prepared to spend a few hours at the airport.
 - The wait at Immigration and Customs area could be long
- The CBSA no longer stamps passports at airports.
 - If you need an entry stamp, you must request from a border services officer after completing a kiosk transaction.
- Once your study permit is issued, <u>check the details</u> on your study permit before you leave the office.
 - Your personal information, Eligibility to work (for academic programs), Remarks etc.
 - If you notice an error, notify the officer before you leave!

Where to stay for quarantine?

- Douglas College has contacted a few Metro Vancouver hotels that might be able to accommodate Douglas International Students. Rates and availability are subject to change without notice.

- To receive the lowest available rate please state that you are a Douglas College international student.



Penalties

Not following instructions or not providing accurate information result in penalties

such as:

- Ticket fine up to \$5,000
- Fine of up to \$750,000 and/or 6 months in prison
- Being found <u>inadmissible</u>, removed from Canada

Quarantine 101

Calculation of your quarantine period

- Your quarantine period begins on the day that you arrive in Canada.
- For example, if you arrive at 11:50 pm on Thursday, October 1, then Thursday is considered day 1 of your quarantine period. Your quarantine period would end 14 days later, on Wednesday, October 14.

During the self-isolation period

- Staff from the International office will check-in for the first 3 days, and then every other day until day 14.
- You are required to reply to the check-ins and update us on your health conditions.
- Failed to reply to the check-in could result on reporting the student to the health authorities.


Commuting between three campuses:

Campus Locations – New West, Anvil Office Tower, Coquitlam



Guard.me

What is Guard.me



- Guard.me is temporary private health insurance to cover you while you are waiting to be eligible for MSP.
- First semester international students at Douglas College are charged \$189.00. This coverage coverage starts on the first day of class, September 7 and ends on December 5, 2021.
- Additional coverage may be purchased for early arrivals or family members.
- Go to our medical insurance page for more information.

When will I receive my Guard.me card?

• New international students will receive their insurance cards after the add/drop date of each each semester, September 21, 2020.

IMPORTANT: If you need any medical assistance before your receive your card, please <u>contact us</u> at dci@douglascollege.ca or call the international office at 604-527-5650.

BC Medical Service plan (MSP)

- Medical Insurance is mandatory while you study in Canada.
- Upon arrival in BC you must apply for MSP. You can apply <u>online</u>.
- MSP covers doctor visits, hospital visits, and medically required services. See the <u>list</u> of medical services that MSP covers.
- \$75.00/month per student.
- Your coverage may <u>start three months after</u> your arrival date in British Columbia.




Coverage period

- If you start your studies at Douglas in Summer semester: Not covered during the Summer Session
- In Fall semester: Covered for one year, from September 1, 2021 to August 31, 2022.

Approximate Cost

• Starting from September: \$250 for one year.
