

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¹Elective(s) : 1000-2000 level courses must be university transferable. A university transferable course is a course that transfers to one of the 5 Research Universities - SFU, UBCV, UBCO, UNBC or UVIC – according to the BC Transfer Guide.

²BLAW 1005 may be substituted for BLAW 1320.

For students contemplating enrolling in the Chartered Professional Accountants (CPA) Professional Education Program (PEP), CPA requires that students successfully complete either (i) BLAW 1005 or (ii) BLAW 1320 and BLAW 3720 to satisfy its law requirements for entrance into PEP.

Students contemplating enrolling in the Douglas College BBA program:

i) should take BLAW 1320 rather than BLAW 1005 in the diploma program; and

ii) may, but are not required to, take BLAW 3720 as an open elective in the diploma program.

³Students who have already taken MATH 1125, can substitute the course for FINC 1231.

⁴Students who have already taken MATH 1160, can substitute the course for BUSN 2429.


To calculate your cummulative GPA (overall Douglas College GPA), add your total points for all courses completed at Douglas that are included* in your GPA and divide by all of your Douglas College GPA credits.

*Note: If you repeat a course at Douglas College, only the attempt with the highest grade is counted in your GPA points and credits.

Improve GPA? Repeat the course;

Academic courses: 2 attempts; (more than twice? Request to repeat a course.

ELLA courses: 2 attempts \rightarrow Request to repeat a course form




Grades

- Not sure what to do?
 - Talk to your instructor, see an academic advisor and international student advisor first.
- GPA-based registration priority system
 - The higher CGPA, the earlier registration timeslot (starting from your second semester).

 - Probation (CGPA falls below 1.50) vs. Academic Alert (between 1.50 and 1.99)



Change of Program

- Why/how did you choose your initial program?
- Why do you want to change your program?
- What kind of career do you want to pursue after graduation?
- Is it an effective way to get around challenging courses?
- Did you check the target program page (overview, admission, graduation requirements, etc.)?
- Will you waste some credits that you have taken or currently taking?
- Deadline to change program?
