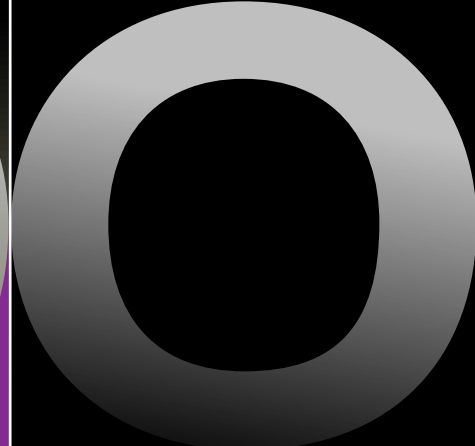

Establishing a home and career in under three years

Ready for a change from her 20-year teaching career in Hong Kong, Shan began researching therapeutic recreation programs in Canada. 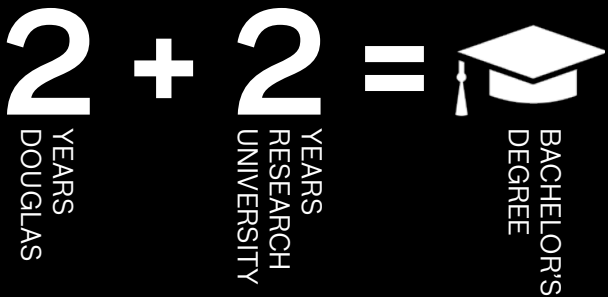

TRANSFER TO A TOP UNIVERSITY

Take the first half of your bachelor’s degree at Douglas College and then transfer your credits to a university to complete your degree. Our classes typically have 35 students, so you’ll get more one-on-one time with your instructors and more opportunities to interact with your classmates than you would at a university, where classes can have up to 500 students. “At Douglas, the class sizes are small, and the instructors give you one-on-one support. They can tell when you’re struggling and they do everything possible to help you improve,” he says.

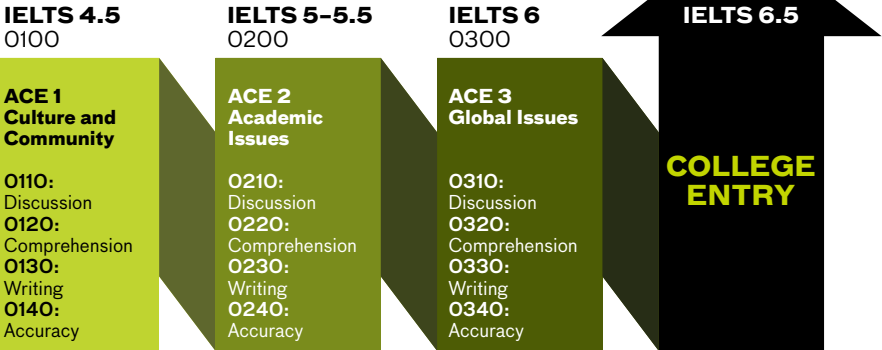
Alp also says learning English helped him get more involved. “I’ve had the opportunity to coach a women’s volleyball team and connect with my peers on a deeper level.”

Encouraged by the ELLA program’s support and the friends he made on the volleyball team, Alp plans to stay in Canada to pursue a Bachelor of Physical Education and Coaching at Douglas and, eventually, open a fitness centre. In the meantime, he has applied for his permanent residency in Canada and is working as a manager for Anytime Fitness, a 24-hour health and fitness centre with locations around the world.

Working for a tech company in the Philippines left Mia feeling unfulfilled in her career. She decided it was time to return to school and try something new.

She discovered Douglas College's Post-Baccalaureate Diploma in Digital Marketing, a short, hands-on program that provided a practical education, and hasn't looked back.

"As soon as I saw the courses in the program, which included one on promotional strategy, I was hooked," she says. "I knew I'd be studying topics that interested me while gaining real-world experience, so the choice was easy."

Mia looked for job opportunities while completing her studies. For a course project in promotional strategy, she was assigned the Vancouver Circus School as her client and had the opportunity to connect with its CEO. She made a strong impression, which led to her being hired as the school's marketing manager on a contract basis.

Since graduation, Mia has enhanced her marketing expertise as an online video content creator. Her work caught the attention of Nest Designs, a baby clothing and accessories company, and earned Mia a full-time position with them as a social media specialist, where she's hoping to gain more experience before opening her own digital marketing agency. "It's rewarding to apply what I learned in class directly to my work."

After completing her bachelor's degree in international business in Vietnam, Kaylin wanted to take her studies abroad in order to gain cross-cultural experience. She found that the Post-Baccalaureate Diploma in Advanced Supply Chain Management at Douglas College aligned perfectly with her educational background, career goals – and more. MAKE CANADA YOUR HOME

As a Douglas College student, you'll have many opportunities to learn about Canadian culture and society. With over 50 programs eligible for the post-graduation work permit (PGWP), you may also be able to get Canadian work experience after graduation.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION about PGWP eligibility

Not all programs are PGWP eligible.

PGWP eligibility is determined by Immigration, Refugees and Citizenship Canada (IRCC), and is subject to change.

The Classification of Instructional Programs (CIP) codes that IRCC uses to determine eligibility may also change without notice.

You'll meet the field of study requirement if you apply for a study permit or PGWP while your program is on the CIP list – even if it changes later.

Drawn by Canada's welcoming atmosphere and tranquil nature, Adriana left Brazil with her husband to pursue another career, this time as a vocational counsellor. She chose Douglas College's Associate of Arts Degree in Psychology – Pre-Bachelor's program to help her get there. “I want to help people identify their career goals and develop employment plans,” she says.

New to Canada – and with a newborn son – money was tight. To help pay her tuition, she applied for the International Entrance Scholarship and Dr. Guangwei Ouyang Entrance Scholarship – and got both.

WHAT'S THE DIFFERENCE BETWEEN POST-SECONDARY CREDENTIALS?

Certificate: Up to one year of full-time study.
Diploma: Typically two years of full-time study.
Associate degree: Two years of university-transfer courses in the arts or sciences. Credits can be transferred to bachelor's degree programs at B.C. universities from recognized B.C. colleges.

Bachelor's degree: Usually requires four years of study. Students gain specialization in one subject area through a major or honours program.
Post-baccalaureate, post-degree or advanced diploma: Typically eight months to two years. Requires a bachelor's degree. Students gain greater specialization in their original area of study or learn skills in a new area.

Master's degree: Typically requires two additional years beyond a bachelor's degree. Offers the option to enhance skills and knowledge through coursework and independent research. Not offered at Douglas.
Doctoral degree (PhD): Typically requires four to seven additional years beyond a master's degree and is the highest level of academic achievement. Not offered at Douglas.

GETTING INTO DOUGLAS

English-language requirements

You are required to demonstrate proficiency in the English language prior to admission to Douglas College. You can do so by providing proof of one of the following (other acceptable substitutes may also be considered):

- English Studies 12 or English First Peoples 12 in B.C. high school, minimum grade "C."
- TOEFL: IBT minimum score 83. Minimum score of 21 in Writing for PDD and PBD programs. Douglas College's institutional code is 9568.
- IELTS (Academic Module): minimum overall score 6.5. For post-degree and post-baccalaureate diploma programs, minimum score of 6.0 for each band. Note: IELTS General is not accepted.
- Duolingo minimum of 110.
- PTE minimum of 56.
- Successful completion of three ELLA (ESL) courses at ACE 3 level at Douglas College.
- Completion of pathway program from one of our internationally acclaimed ESL partners.

Academic program requirements

Undergraduate (diploma, certificate, associate degree and bachelor's degree) programs:

- High school graduation and minimum 17 years of age by the first day of class; and
- Minimum overall grade average of "C" or 60 percent or equivalent in the final year of high school; and
- Minimum final grade of "C" or 60 percent in Grade 11 Mathematics or equivalent for most programs

Post-degree and post-baccalaureate programs:

- Graduation from a recognized degree-granting post-secondary institution with a minimum three-year bachelor's degree; and
- Minimum cumulative grade average of "C" or 60 percent or equivalent during bachelor's degree program

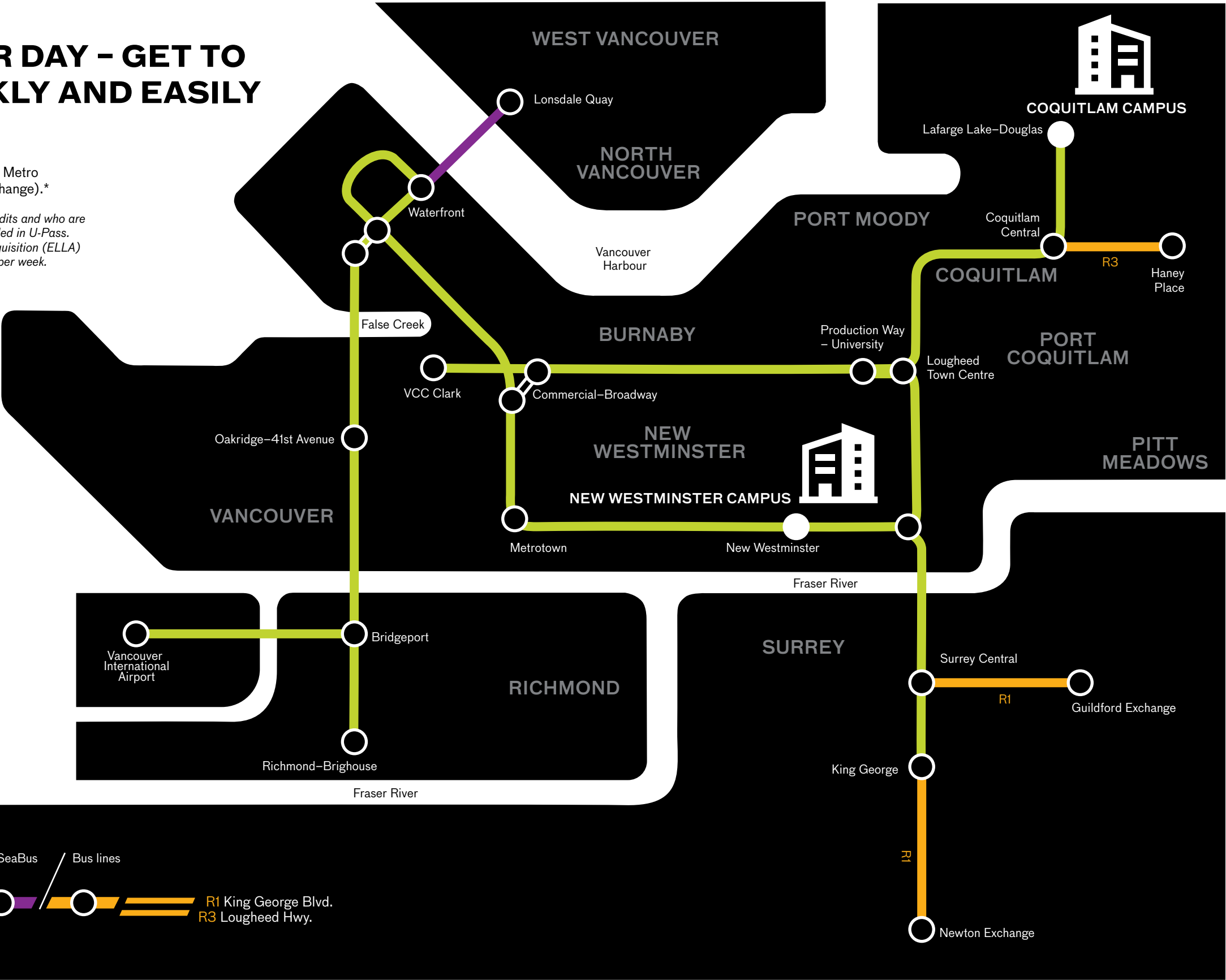
