New Student Orientation

The New Student Orientation program offers a mix of digital and in-person experiences, helping you explore available services, connect with faculty and peers and navigate our campuses.

- (1) <u>Faculty/ General New Student Orientation Sessions</u>: Choose the one offered by your faculty.* If its schedule does not work for you or if there is not one being offered for your faculty, attend the general one.
 - Faculty of Commerce and Business Administration (CBA): New Westminster | August 21 | <u>Register now</u>**
 - Faculty of Humanities and Social Sciences (HSS) and Faculty of Language, Literature and Performing Arts (LLPA): New Westminster | August 22 | <u>Register now</u>**
 - Faculty of Science and Technology (S&T): Coquitlam | August 20 | <u>Register now</u>** or New Westminster | August 22 | <u>Register now</u>**
 - General Orientation Sessions parents and supporters are welcome: Coquitlam | August 19 | <u>Register now</u>** or New Westminster | August 21 | <u>Register now</u>**

* If you are unsure which faculty you are in, check out the <u>**Programs webpage**</u>. ** Registration using desktop devices is highly recommended for better user experience.

- (2) <u>New International Student Orientation Session</u>: If you are an international student, apart from the Faculty/ General orientations mentioned above, you are also encouraged to attend the international orientation on August 27. Registration will be available on the <u>Orientation webpage</u> beginning August 13.
- (3) <u>Orientation Workshops</u>: Check out the <u>workshop offerings</u> and be sure to register for the ones that best fit your needs.

(4) <u>DCUE 0200 - New Student Orientation</u>: Can't remember all the information from orientations? This course is a hub of all the basics of how to get ready for your first semester including the new student checklist. It will be made available on <u>Blackboard</u> beginning early August. Log on with your 9-digit student number and CNA password and access the course under "Courses". Those who complete the course by semester end will enter a draw to win \$250 in tuition credit!

Understanding academic integrity

Douglas College expects students to adhere to the highest standards of

academic integrity. To help you understand what academic integrity means at Douglas, all new students will be automatically enrolled into DCUE 0100 - Academic Integrity, an online course that lives on <u>Blackboard</u>. This course is mandatory. Students are expected to complete the course before your first semester begins. Students who do not complete the course with a passing grade will not be allowed to register for future semesters until it is completed. Class registration and fee payment

(*Information in this section is applicable to domestic students only. Please refer to separate instructions provided by Douglas College International (DCI) if you are an international student.)

If you have not registered for all your classes, have a look through the <u>Register for</u> <u>classes webpage</u>. If you are on a waitlist for some of your classes, don't worry, there is still a chance you'll make it into the classes. When you are on the waitlist, be sure to check your <u>myAccount</u> every day because if you are given an offer, you only have **23 hours** to accept it. If you miss your offer, you will be removed from the waitlist. If you still find yourself on a waitlist on the first day of class, attend the first class to talk to the instructor and indicate your interest.
