

INDIGENOUS SKILLS FOR SUCCESS JOURNEY, PLANTING THE SEEDS FOR GROWTH

Pilot Course Participation Information & Registration

Douglas College and Paintedstone and Associates Learning Systems (PALS) have refreshed the course “*An Aboriginal Essential Skills Journey, Planting the Seeds for Growth*” to reflect Canada’s “Skills for Success” framework from a culturally sensitive lens and through a transition to an online delivery format.

What is the pilot course about?

Who is the Course For?

Leaders and front-line workers serving Indigenous Communities and Persons in Education, Human Resources, Workplace Training, Career and Employment Counselling

How Long is the Course?

- **5 weeks Course:** 1 hour webinar and 2 to 3 hours (estimation) per week for independent online activities (total course hours estimated at 15 to 20 hours)
- **On-Demand Sessions** will be offered to groups of 8 or more where course length can be adjusted based on needs.

What Supports will Pilot Participants Receive?

- **Learner Boxes** containing a variety of tools to compliment the course
- **Certificate of Completion** providing equivalency to the Introductory Course of the Skills for Success Practitioner CE Certificate Program* (for those who complete the course)
- **Facilitator and Skills Coach Support**
- **Access to course materials**, facilitator guides and participant workbooks, and new learner tools and resources

What is expected of Pilot Participants in order to complete the course:

- Attend and participate in webinars 1 time per week for 5 weeks
- Participate in course discussions
- Complete course activities to demonstrate learner outcomes

NOTE – In order to maintain a record of course completion Pilot Participants are asked to provide name, address, birthdate, email and phone number as required for Douglas College registration systems. All information is maintained confidentially and will not be shared.

*The program name change from Essential Skills Practitioner Training program to Skills for Success Practitioner Program is currently in progress through a review by the Douglas College Education Council.

What other expectations are there?

- Complete brief feedback survey information to help improve the pilot course, and
- Pilot Skills for Success Learner Tools with 5 Indigenous Learners
