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<p><b>F:</b> Calendar Description:</p> <p>This course provides a hands-on introduction to networking and the internet using tools and hardware commonly found in home and small business environments. Labs include PC installation, internet connectivity, wireless connectivity, file and print sharing and the installation of game consoles, scanners and cameras. The course teaches students the skills needed to obtain entry-level home network installer jobs. It also helps students develop some of the skills needed to become network technicians, computer technicians, cable installers and help desk technicians.</p> <p><i>Note: Students who have received credit for CISY 2345 or CISY 2346 will not receive further credit for CSIS 1150.</i></p>
