### COURSE OBJECTIVES, CONTENT, METHOD, EVALUATION:

#### **OBJECTIVES**

Students will be exposed to problems arising from performance of ensemble music with emphasis on rehearsal techniques and conductor-performer relationship.

#### CONTENT

Using suitable ensemble music, students will study balance, intonation, phrasing, dynamics, group discipline and interpretation of aural and visual signals by the instructor.

#### **METHOD**

The student will attend a rehearsal each week for the duration of two hours and further student directed learning.

### <u>EVALUATION</u>

The student will be evaluated on the basis of progress made in the various aspects of the course.
