O. Course Objectives:

The course offers instruction in further development of aural and sight singing skills.

P. Course Content:

1. Ear Training

- a) Identification of compound intervals up to the P12
- b) Identification of triads in 1st and 2nd inversions
- c) Identification of chords in four-part style both in 1st and 2nd inversions
- d) Rapid identification of notes in major and minor scales
- e) Identification of seventh chords in root position
- f) Identification of simple harmonic progressions in major and minor modes
- g) Rhythmic dictation
- h) Melodic dictation

2. Sight Singing

- a) Singing of ascending and descending intervals
- b) Singing of notes of triads in 1st and 2nd inversions
- c) Singing of notes in secondary seventh chords
- d) Singing of tonal melodies containing intervals of 6ths, 7ths, and 9ths

3. Rhythmic training

- a) Continuing work in analysis of rhythms
- b) Singing and tapping of rhythmic patterns
- c) method of conducting

Students will be trained and drilled in execution of aural and sight singing skills.

R. Course Evaluation:

Evaluation is based on the following three points:

Daily Test (dictation and singing) - 60% (minimum of one per week)

Mid-term test - 20%

Final test - 20%
