	 Aural Recognition Aural Recognition Melodies which contain longer phrases, some chromatic tones, and modulation to closely-related keys. Simple two-part melodic textures. Soprano and bass factors, quality, and position of chords in progressions which include: root-position and inverted seventh chords, borrowed chords, applied (secondary) dominant chords, the Neapolitan Sixth chord, and non-modulating sequences. Longer and more complex rhythmic exercises. 				
	 2. Sight Singing a) Melodies which include large intervals, harmonic and non-harmonic chromatic tones, and modulation to closely-related keys. b) Longer and more complex rhythmic exercises. 				
0:	Methods of Instruction Students will receive two hours of class instruction per week: one hour of harmonic dictation; one hour of sight singing and melodic/rhythmic dictation.
