## M: Course Objectives/Learning Outcomes

At the end of the course the successful student should be able to demonstrate satisfactory skill development in aural recognition and sight singing of tonal melodies, harmonies, and rhythms as outlined in section N.

#### N: Course Content

- 1. Aural Recognition
  - a) Melodies which contain longer phrases, some chromatic tones, and modulation to distant keys.
  - b) Melodies in two- and three-part textures.
  - c) Soprano and bass factors, quality, and position of chords in progressions which include: augmented sixth chords, diminished seventh chords, extended dominant chords, and modulation to distant keys.
  - d) Complex rhythmic patterns including changing meters.
- 2. Sight Singing
  - a) Melodies which contain more complex rhythms, chromatic alterations, and modulations to distant keys.
  - b) Non-tonal melodies.
  - c) Complex rhythmic exercises.

## O: Methods of Instruction

Students will receive two hours of class instruction per week: one hour of harmonic dictation; one hour of sight singing and melodic/rhythmic dictation.

## P: Textbooks and Materials to be Purchased by Students

Textbooks and materials are listed on the Instructor's Course Outline.

### Q: Means of Assessment

Sight Singing Tests (minimum 4) 40%
Melodic and Rhythmic Dictation Tests (minimum 4) 20%
Harmonic Dictation Tests (minimum 4) 40%
