M: Course Objectives/Learning Outcomes

- 1. Students will be able to describe the multiple aspects of staging a play and gain an appreciation for the team work, cooperation and discipline that is involved.
- 2. Students will be able to demonstrate a degree of technical proficiency for their particular area of production.
- 3. Students will be able to demonstrate a responsible and professional attitude toward their assigned tasks.
- 4. Students will develop the organizational and managerial skills required by crew heads when dealing with production schedules and personnel.

N: Course Content

Participation as a crew head in a theatrical production including pre-production, technical rehearsals, running of a show and post-production.

Students will be assigned and participate in one or more of the following: set, costume, lighting, or sound design; technical direction, stage management; head of costumes, carpentry, stage, electrics, properties, or paint.

Students may be required to participate in off campus productions. This may include assigned hours at facilities such as Langara College's Studio 58, The Massey Theatre, The Playhouse Theatre etc

O: Methods of Instruction

Practical labs in which students will learn and demonstrate skills relevant to their assigned areas.

P: Textbooks and Materials to be Purchased by Students

Grade 1, green triangle CSA approved safety footwear, work gloves, safety glasses, hearing protection, tool belt, 3/4 "wide imperial/metric 16' tape measure, 6" or 8" crescent wrench, small glue gun, side cutters/needle nose pliers or "multitool", AA flashlight or "maglight", utility or "olfa" knife, multi screwdriver, black shirt, black pants, black socks, and black shoes for backstage running crew.

Q: Means of Assessment

A minimum of 150 hours of active involvement as a crew head in an assigned production is required in order to receive a passing grade.
